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





Adirondack Rail Trail: Lake Placid to Old Forge—first stop Tupper Lake

The railroad ceased regular service on this historic line in 1972. For the past twelve years, a tourist train has been operating on the nine miles of track between Lake Placid and Saranac Lake. The justification for spending taxpayer money on this project was based on anticipated economic benefits to the Tri-Lakes area. Yet the train has provided no recreational benefits and its effect on the regional economy has been negligible.

ARTA foresees far greater public benefits by converting the rail bed into a multi-use trail that will be a major tourist destination in the Adirondack Park while serving the recreational needs of local residents.

Why we need the Adirondack Rail Trail

The Adirondack Park has thousands of miles of hiking trails and seemingly unlimited waterways for boating and paddling. But nowhere in the Adirondacks is there a level, compactly surfaced, long-distance trail that connects our communities, traverses wild and beautiful terrain, and can be enjoyed by people of all ages and physical ability. The Adirondack Rail Trail will fulfill this need.

At a time of growing concern about the alienation of children from nature, the Adirondack Rail Trail will reconnect young people with the natural world. At a time when a sedentary lifestyle is contributing to heart disease and obesity, this multi-use trail will provide a healthy alternative for families and friends to enjoy together, for young and old, for leisurely outings and extended touring.

Why not keep the train and build a trail beside the tracks?

It might be possible to do this between Lake Placid and Saranac Lake, but there's no way a

parallel trail could be built beyond that point. Widening the rail corridor from 8 to 20 feet to accommodate a separate trail would require dumping tons of fill into lakes and wetlands. The costs, both financial and environmental, would be prohibitive. The only logical place for the trail is on—not next to—the existing rail bed.

The Adirondack Rail Trail can be done at great savings to taxpayers.

The Department of Transportation (DOT) has already spent \$25 million in rehabilitating the rail corridor and anticipates spending \$43 million more if the entire railroad line is restored. By comparison, the national Rails-to-Trails Conservancy (RTC) estimates that a multi-use trail from Lake Placid to Tupper Lake, a distance of 34 miles, can be established at no cost to taxpayers simply by salvaging the rails and ties from Saranac Lake to Old Forge. Without the rails in place, the snowmobile season along the corridor will double, with the attendant economic benefits.

Two independent consultants, the Rails to Trails Conservancy (RTC) and Stone Consulting, compared the impact on our local economies of restoring train service and converting the corridor to a trail.

The Adirondack Rail Trail will greatly stimulate business.

The trail will function as a new tourist destination in the Adirondacks, attracting visitors from far and wide. Cyclists and others who flock to the trail will buy food, clothing, and outdoor gear, and they will patronize restaurants and lodging places. New businesses will spring up along the path. This is not pie-in-the-sky speculation—rail trails are enjoying great success throughout the country, drawing hundreds of thousands of users and contributing millions of dollars to local economies.

The Adirondack Rail Trail will highlight natural history.

The trail will pass through a forested landscape of lakes, ponds, streams and wetlands. With proper interpretive signage and self-guiding brochures, it could be one of the finest nature trails in the country.

The Adirondack Rail Trail will celebrate our cultural heritage.

This rail corridor played a key role in opening the region for lumbering, mining, health care and tourism. A safe, scenic, long-distance trail will commemorate that tradition and interpret Adirondack history for millions of users in the years ahead. The historic train stations along the way can serve as rest stops, information centers, cafes, bike shops and museums.

Legal status of travel corridor.

The corridor is owned by the people of the state, managed by the Department of Transportation, and leased to the Adirondack Scenic Railroad. The lease can be renewed or terminated as appropriate. The current management plan contains a recreational-use option in the event the train


Dear Paul,

Thanks for taking the time to speak with me a few days ago. Per our phone conversation; I have included a few documents for your review, which I believe show that snowmobiling would not suffer from converting the corridor to a recreation trail:

- 1) Letter from Attorney Robert J. Kafin indicating that removing the rails will not affect the right of way as a state-sanctioned travel corridor
- 2) Copy of page 44 from the Unit Management Plan specifically referring to Snowmobiles in the Central Section of the corridor
- 3) Resolution passed by the Adirondack Council on 02/07/12 indicating they will respect the integrity of the corridor no matter what it's use
- 4) Memo from Attorney Robert J. Kafin addressing historical designation
- 5) Resolution from the New York State Snowmobile Association supporting removal of the rails and creation of a trail with conditions
- 6) Copy of the 2012 Outdoor Recreation Economy Report describing how the outdoor industry can create stable job growth and spur the economy. (Please note page 4 which indicates that Americans spend more on bicycling gear and trips than they do on airplane tickets and fees)

However, over 500 people from Tupper Lake have signed up in support of a recreation trail and I believe it deserves some serious deliberation by our elected officials based on facts and not emotions. To the Editor:

Your editorial advocating both a restored rail system and a multi-purpose train on the Adirondack Rail Corridor is idealistic. But its goal is impossible. And one of the reasons stated – that removing the rails would result in the discontinuance of the right of way as a state-sanctioned travel corridor -- is wrong.

The corridor is an important economic, historic and recreational resource, which is publicly owned. What is now limiting getting the optimum benefit from it is the existing rails and ties, which reduce the utility of this magnificent linear space and restrict it for most of the year and much of its length to the relatively insignificant traffic of a privately run tourist train.

Removing the rails and ties would in no way, shape or form change the public ownership of the corridor, reduce public access or make it less available for recreational activities. To the contrary: it would open up the resource, increase accessibility, invite more visitation from locals and tourists, and make the restored train station in Tupper Lake more used and valuable.

You see the existing rails and ties as an asset that should be retained. In fact, they are an impediment that privatizes public property and prevents the highest and best use of this extraordinary travel corridor and impedes progress towards a truly wonderful multi-purpose trail with the potential to deliver recreational pleasures to a huge population and economic rewards to Tupper Lake and other communities along the corridor.

Remsen-Lake Placid Corridor Management Plan which is being prepared.) Establish a new ten (10) car parking area in the old pit just across the railroad tracks near the Moose River. Replace the current gate with a new gate located a little closer to Rt. 28. Leave the gate open or closed depending on the Forest Ranger's assessment of the condition of the entire road." While there is rail use of the Corridor, it would not be desirable to create an unsafe crossing. The parking area recommended above should not be constructed unless the possibility of rail use is eliminated. If trains are using the Corridor, only rail-based recreation should be considered at this location.

H. PUBLIC USE MANAGEMENT AND CONTROLS

1. Snowmobiles in the Central Section

The railroad corridor has been classified in the Adirondack Park State Land Master Plan as a travel corridor. Snowmobiles are a means of travel, and they represent a winter economic advantage to communities along the Corridor. As the entity responsible for the management of the adjacent State land, the Department of Environmental Conservation does realize the value of the central section as a large, roadless area. Although believing it is important to perpetuate this area's wild character, the Department does not endorse the integration of all classifications into one large wilderness area at this location. The Department's goal is to protect not only wilderness, but also to ensure the benefits provided by a public and private mix of classifications. Further guidance for the region will be provided by individual Forest Preserve unit management plans, as well as State planning efforts of a broader scope.

2. TRESPASS

Education of the user public about the need to respect the rights of private landowners is important to prevent trespass on private land as much as possible. It is concluded that a small percentage of users actually knowingly trespass from the Corridor onto private lands and education of the user public is imperative. Two gates will be placed at access points near Lake Lila and any other un-gated locations with the potential for illegal access. Appropriate signing at Corridor access points and intersections will be a deterrent to inappropriate use (see Appendix 26.) As with hiking trails on other State land, signs will be posted at all junctures with private roads and trails, indicating the adjacent property is private and access is not permitted. Forest Rangers and Conservation Officers have, and will continue to enforce illegal access from the Corridor. As with other areas of State land, the first line responsibility for enforcement of the misuse of State land rests with the Forest Ranger and incidents should be reported to the local ranger. Patrol of the few known access points to private lands should frustrate illegal ingress. It is the intent of the State to monitor counts of use and trespass. The issuance of an annual Corridor snowmobile permit, in the absence of substantial

Rails-to-Trails Conversions in the Adirondack Park
Remsen to Lake Placid Rail Corridor

1. **The Adirondack Council supports the conversion of railroad lines to multi-use recreational trails in those cases where the presence of the rail lines are no longer in the public interest, and the conversion has no undue environmental impacts on the Adirondack Park Forest Preserve or other natural resources.**
2. **Specific proposals for rails-to-trails conversions will be considered on an individual basis due to the potential legal, regulatory, ownership and other issues that may relate to their conversion.**
3. **In the specific case of the Remsen to Lake Placid rail corridor, the Adirondack Council recognizes and respects the unique heritage of the corridor, as per its inclusion on the State and National Registers of Historic Places, and will advocate for its preservation as a separate transportation/recreational corridor following the guidance of the current Remsen-Lake Placid Travel Corridor Unit Management Plan, or approved revisions.**

There is no basis for the argument that taking out the rails and ties would violate the State Land Master Plan and cause the right of way to lose its classification as a "Travel Corridor" or cause portions of the right of way to be absorbed into adjacent Forest Preserve Units and have to be governed by their UMPs. That's baloney. There is absolutely nothing that makes the rails and ties essential to the classification of the right of way under the State Land Master Plan.

The UMP for the Remsen-Lake Placid Travel Corridor will have to be amended and updated, but that's supposed to be done every five years anyhow. Under the State Land Master Plan UMPs can be changed by DEC – and should be from time to time, and the APA Act specifically authorizes amendments. So, if it is determined that the right of way consist of lands within "units of land classified in the master plan for management of state lands", then if management of those lands involves the development and maintenance of a recreational trail in some way that is not already part of any UMP that applies to those lands, then the UMPs can be amended to allow for the appropriate management.

Both the Plan and the UMP for it make it abundantly clear that it is the corridor itself – i.e. its continuity and length, its historical significance and its setting – that is the "unique State land resource". Not rails and ties. And for that reason, the corridor is supposed to have its own classification and its own UMP, and it would be contrary to the State Land Master Plan for the corridor's management to become subject to the UMPs for adjacent Forest Preserve Units.

The land (railroad right of way) is owned by the State of New York. Being in the Forest Preserve certainly doesn't prevent the use of the land as a recreational trail. It is either Forest Preserve or not, and removing rails and ties does not change its status.

Arguing over whether the rails and ties themselves are part of what is listed on the National Register of Historic Places is a red herring. It doesn't matter. Because the entire right of way is listed, any "project" that involves state agency action within the listed right of way will require going through a process set up by the New York State Historic Preservation Act of 1980. The listing does not prohibit the removal of the rails and tracks, nor does it prohibit turning the right of way from one used by trains to one used by bikes, snow mobiles and pedestrians. It does require touching bases inside Federal and state government, giving notices, documenting conditions, preparing reports and doing things like posting informational signs, taking pictures, moving artifacts to museums (or displaying them at or near the listed area), etc. There is a whole consultant industry that has sprung up to assist real estate developers in working projects through the State Historic Preservation Office (SHPO) – and you can be darn sure that the State DOT itself has staff that do nothing else other than push transportation projects that affect historic resources through the SHPO.

I recommend that you acknowledge the listing of the right of way on the Historic Register and note that ARTA expects DOT and its citizen supporters to comply fully with the State Historic Preservation Act. At the end of the day, the Historic District, and its historic resources, will be better protected and enhanced by what you propose than by neglect or the continuation of the current poor quality and inadequate use and maintenance of the right of way.

Make the historic listing an asset in support of the trail and never concede that it in any way is an obstacle or that anything being proposed detracts from the historic value of the right of way – or ever denigrate its historic value.

WHEREAS, the New York State Snowmobile Association represent snowmobilers from throughout the State of New York and beyond; and

WHEREAS, snowmobiling contributes \$868 million dollars in to the New York State economy; and

WHEREAS, the New York State Snowmobile Association has held for many years and holds the "temporary use permit" for snowmobile use and trail maintenance activity in which many snowmobile clubs and volunteers participate; and

WHEREAS, the Adirondacks is the number one area for snowmobiling in the State holding 28% of all snowmobile activity in NY; and

WHEREAS, a Unit Management Plan was prepared by a committee of state agencies led by NYS Department of Transportation in 1995; and

WHEREAS , this UMP identified the RR corridor as an important artery connecting snowmobile trails throughout a major portion of the Adirondack area; and

WHEREAS, the use of the corridor as a train corridor during three seasons of the year was identified to allow the railroad service to grow; and

WHEREAS , railroad service has not been established along the entire length of the rail corridor seventeen years after the adoption of the original UMP; and

WHEREAS , the cost of bringing this section of track up to a useable standard for train service is estimated to be well beyond, state and federal resources for the foreseeable future; and

WHEREAS , the temporary removal of track would allow that reach of the corridor to be developed into a multi-use trail that could bring immediate economic benefits to the adjoining communities and allow an extended snowmobile season; and




Annual Consumer Spending, in Billions






WHAT DRIVES THE OUTDOOR RECREATION ECONOMY?

The outdoor recreation economy thrives when Americans spend their hard-earned dollars in the pursuit of outdoor recreation. This spending occurs in two forms: the purchase of gear and vehicles, and dollars spent on trips and travel.

Gear purchases include anything for outdoor recreation, such as outdoor apparel and footwear, bicycles, skis, fishing waders, tents, rifles or backpacks. Vehicle purchases include vehicles and accessories used only for outdoor recreation, such as boats, motorcycles, RVs, snowmobiles and all-terrain vehicles.¹

And they visit recreation areas that are cared for by land managers, park rangers, NGOs and volunteers.

This spending is the outdoor recreation economy — \$646 billion in spending that each year supports 6.1 million direct jobs and \$80 billion in federal, state and local tax revenue.



When Americans play outside during day outings or overnight trips, their spending directly supports professions like guides and outfitters, lodging operators, park managers and rangers, concessionaires, small business owners and many more.

In total, 6.1 million American livelihoods¹ directly depend on outdoor recreation, making it a critical economic sector in the United States.


Average Salaries Generated²

This report calculates the direct economic impact for an expanded set of outdoor recreation activities, some of which were not included in the prior report.


Therefore, care should be taken when attempting to make a trend analysis between this report and the prior report.







Recreation visits to Department of Interior-managed lands result in over 316,000 jobs and nearly \$25 billion in economic impacts each year to the communities and regions surrounding Interior-managed land.¹

Nearly 35 million people visit national wildlife refuges annually, supporting almost 27,000 private sector jobs and producing about \$543 million in employment income.²

Rural western counties with more than 30 percent of their land under federal protection increased jobs at a rate four times faster than rural counties with no federally protected lands.³





Outdoor Recreation Strengthens Local Communities

THE OUTDOOR RECREATION ECONOMY GENERATES \$80 BILLION IN NATIONAL, STATE AND LOCAL TAX REVENUES EACH YEAR.

Cities and towns across the country are tapping into the business of outdoor recreation, and with good reason. They recognize that outdoor recreation and open spaces are key ingredients to healthy communities, contribute to a high quality of life, and most importantly, attract and sustain businesses and families.





GET OUT WEST! INITIATIVE

The Western Governors' Association reports that outdoor recreation in 19 western states results in \$256 billion in direct spending and 2.3 million jobs.¹

OGDEN, UT

The City of Ogden recognizes the potential to transform the city from a forlorn railroad town to one of the country's top outdoor destinations. By investing in public space restoration, Ogden adds more jobs than any other region in the country, lowers crime by 33 percent, and secures more than \$1.2 billion in investment – all while lowering taxes three times.²

CENTRAL PARK, NEW YORK CITY, NY

A cluster of enterprises, events and activities connected to Central Park generates \$395 million in economic activity, and more than 3,780 jobs. Additionally, an analysis of NYC parks finds that land values of residential properties increase the closer they are to a park.³

STURGIS, SD

The annual Sturgis Motorcycle Rally generates more than \$800 million in economic activity to the region from an estimated 417,000 visitors who stay an average of nearly six days.⁴

CINCINNATI, OH

Research finds that homeowners are willing to pay a premium of \$9,000 on houses that are within 1,000 feet of bike paths.⁵

COLORADO

The USA Pro Cycling Challenge reports more than \$83.5 million in economic impact during the one-week period, with more than one million spectators lining the roads.⁶

SALT LAKE CITY, UT

The Outdoor Retailer summer and winter trade shows draw more than 46,000 people annually to Salt Lake City, generating more than \$40 million annually for the local community.⁷

GREAT ALLEGHENY PASSAGE

Connecting Washington, D.C. to metro Pittsburgh, the trail generates \$7 million in direct spending.⁸

PORTLAND, OR

The City of Portland targets the outdoor industry as part of its five-year economic growth and job creation strategy. The athletic and outdoor industry in Oregon directly employs more than 14,000 workers.⁹

CODY, WY

About 10 percent of jobs in Cody, Wyoming, are associated with direct spending on fishing, hunting and wildlife viewing. Hunters, anglers and wildlife watchers contribute an estimated \$30.1 million to Cody's economy.⁹

And \$646 Billion Is Just the Beginning

The Outdoor Recreation Economy report takes a conservative approach in tracking direct annual spending by Americans in pursuit of outdoor recreation across 10 activity categories (Bicycling, Camping, Fishing, Hunting, Motorcycling, Off-Road, Snow Sports, Trail Sports, Water Sports and Wildlife Viewing). It is not inclusive of every activity that could be recognized as outdoor recreation. Vehicles used for commercial purposes or commuting are not included, nor is spending by international visitors.

Most importantly, the report focuses on direct economic impact¹, rather than using indirect, implied, multiplier or ripple effects that include impacts of spending, jobs and wages as they circulate further throughout the economy. If these effects were used as the basis of this report, the stated economic impact and jobs impact would be substantially larger.


In Conclusion

I don't usually advocate for private membership organizations, but I'm making an exception in the case of the New York State Rural Housing Coalition. This organization provides training and advocacy programs with a focus on the housing needs of lower income households in rural areas of the state. They lobby the state legislature to promote funding for housing and community development activities and they represent the interests of their members in the agencies that administer those programs. They also organize a statewide conference each fall that showcases the best practices of local communities and non-profits who are using federal and state funding to administer local programs.

When the CDBG Program was administered by HUD, we had lots of opportunities to meet with federal and state officials and our peers at meetings and conferences throughout the year. Those opportunities have declined since the state took over administration of the program in 2000 and the annual conference that is organized by the Rural Housing Coalition is now the only one left. This organization is also the only advocacy group left that can represent us effectively at the state level. That has become more important in recent years as the Office of Community Renewal has continued to restrict access to information about the annual funding competitions and the process it uses to select the "winners" in those lotteries.

We began making this appeal last year when the Rural Housing Coalition was caught in the state budget crunch and almost had to close its doors. Several local communities were convinced to join the Coalition and that cash infusion made a big difference in helping the organization survive the budget crunch. We have just returned from the 30th Annual Conference, which was held in Albany again this year. It looks like the Coalition will survive with the support of its members and continue to provide important advocacy for the programs that have made a difference in local communities all across the state.

Please consider investing \$375 to keep the Rural Housing Coalition in business. I have attached a membership application and ask that you bring it to the Mayor and Village Board and ask them to consider a membership in this organization as part of your local community development activities.




FENCING

- 1) Definitions: The following words, terms and phrases, when used in this article shall have the meanings ascribed to them in this section, except where the context clearly indicates a different meaning:
 - a) Barrier – A fence, wall or other structure built to bar passage. Large Concrete blocks are used as barriers.
 - b) Fence – An enclosing barrier that prohibits through passage.
 - c) Fence; decorative – Fencing that adds beauty and does not substantially block the view and maintains the open space characteristic provided for by zoning standards.
 - d) Swimming Pool – A pool of water 24" or greater in depth either indoors or outdoors and is used for swimming or water related recreations. This also includes spas and hot tubs.
 - e) Visibility Range – Distance required to afford proper vision for pedestrian and vehicular traffic at intersections and/or corners.
 - f) Front Yard: A yard extending along the whole length of the front lot line between the side lot lines, and being the minimum horizontal distance between the street line and the main building or any projections thereof other than steps, planter boxes, unenclosed porches and driveways.
 - g) Pylon's – Concrete pylon's barriers monolithic structures to impede movement, or passage.
 - h) Temporary Fence – A fence installed for a temporary event, construction site or for emergency reasons. A temporary fence can only be installed for one week unless the code officer feels there is good reason to keep the temporary fence up for a longer period of time. Emergency reasons would be a natural disaster, a fire scene or an unsafe condition etc...
- 2) Permits Required - It shall be unlawful for any person to erect, construct, enlarge, alter, repair, replace, remove or demolish any fence regulated by this article without first obtaining a separate permit for each fence from the building official of the building inspection division of the community development department. A fence permit shall not be required if it is determined by the building official of the building inspection department that only minor repair or painting is necessary.
- 3) General Requirements and Restrictions:
 - a. Fences constructed on any lot, and specifically corner lots, will be subject to, and shall conform to, the visibility range requirements contained in the drawing at the end of this section. An additional clear zone may be required by the code officer.
 - b. No fence, guy wire, brace or post shall be constructed upon or extend over property that the Village has control over, owns, or has an easement over or under, except upon:
 - i. Underground drainage easements that contain non-pressurized storm sewer

NYS DOT ANNOUNCES DESIGN DECISION FOR TUPPER LAKE VILLAGE RECONSTRUCTION PROJECT, FRANKLIN COUNTY

The New York State Department of Transportation (NYS DOT), after consideration of public input, has selected a preferred alternative for the reconstruction of State Routes 3 and 30 in the Village of Tupper Lake. The selected alternative will utilize the existing highway footprint rather than pursue development of a new alignment, which would have significant impacts on existing properties and businesses in the village.

The selected alternative involves the reconstruction of Wawbeek Avenue, Park Street, Mill Street and Lake Street from Pleasant Avenue to Mill Street. Minor improvements will be made to the remainder of Lake Street as part of the project to accommodate traffic using Lake Street as a detour around on going work. The project will also include improvements to the water and sewer lines along the length of the project.

The \$12.7 million project is expected to go bid in October of 2014, and begin construction in the spring of 2015. It is anticipated to be a two year project.

Dear Mr. Bouck:

We are pleased to advise you that we anticipate there will be **no reduction in firm hydro energy sales to our hydropower customers for the period of December 1 through 31 2012.** The forecasted December 2012 generation is projected to be sufficient to meet our firm hydropower customers' needs. However, if that generation is not sufficient, Substitute Energy will be purchased on your behalf for those customers with signed Substitute Energy agreements.

Since hydro shortfalls may still be anticipated in future months, we remain prepared to provide Substitute Energy to assure continuous flow of the lowest cost power to you. For those customers who have executed a Substitute Energy agreement, the Power Authority will automatically purchase the Substitute Energy on your behalf in months that a shortage occurs, pursuant to those agreements, unless otherwise notified. The monthly price for Substitute Energy is an average of all Substitute Energy provided to firm hydropower customers each month.

The Power Authority continues to be concerned about the river flows projected for 2013. Current estimates are no shortage January 2013 through June 2013. We will continue to analyze more current data monthly and provide this type of rolling 6-month forecast each month.

We have completed the structural analysis of the (8) stadium monopoles and **have found them to be adequate within the scope of this analysis to support the proposed light fixture loading.** The towers were analyzed according to the requirements of TIA/EIA 222-F standard for Franklin County for 70 mph (fastest mile) wind speed with no ice and 61 mph wind with 1/2" ice.

The tower's we analyzed were (8) identical 80' Monopoles consisting of (3) round slip jointed members. Pole diameters range from 7 5/16" at the top to 17 5/8" at the base. Foundation capacities were predicated on supplied as-built details.

The loading used in the analysis consisted of the existing light fixtures/lines as well as the following:

- Remove (12) existing sports lighting fixtures and (12) existing 7/8" feed lines @ 76.5'
- Add (12) Universal Sports Lighting FCES15-U @ 76.5' on proposed light fixture frames
- Add (2) 5/8" power cables to 76.5'

Proposed power cables are to be located inside the pole.

The results of the analysis showed all tower and foundation elements to be loaded within allowable limits. We recommend a post-construction inspection be completed by an engineer to document that tower-mounted equipment has been placed in compliance with the requirements of this analysis. For a detailed listing of the tower's performance, please see page 3 of 3 of the calculations.



PRIMARY ASSUMPTIONS USED IN THE ANALYSIS

1. Allowable steel stresses are defined by AISC-ASD 9th Edition and all welds conform to AWS D1-1 specifications.
2. Armor Tower has been commissioned to analyze the tower according to the requirements of TIA/EIA 222-F for Franklin County, New York. Per this code, a basic wind speed of 70 mph (fastest mile) without ice and 61 mph with ½" ice is recommended. This site is not within a special wind region. Note that Section 3108.4 of the International Building Code states that "Towers shall be designed to resist wind loads according to TIA/EIA-222".
3. Any deviation from the analyzed light fixture loading will require a re-analysis of the tower for verification of structural integrity. Proposed power cables are to be located inside the pole.
4. This analysis assumes all tower members are galvanized adequately to prevent corrosion of the steel and that all tower members are in "like new" condition with no physical deterioration. This analysis also assumes the tower has been maintained properly per TIA/EIA 222-F Annex E recommended inspection and maintenance procedures for tower owners and is in a plumb condition. Armor Tower has completed a condition assessment of the tower in a separate document.
5. No accounting for residual stresses due to incorrect tower erection can be made. This analysis assumes all bolts are appropriately tightened providing necessary connection continuity and that the installation of the tower was performed by a qualified tower erector.
6. Foundation capacities are based on normal soil parameters in the absence of geotechnical boring logs. If more accurate data for soil properties is required, it is the client's responsibility to obtain the appropriate boring logs.
7. No conclusions, expressed or implied, shall indicate that Armor Tower has made an evaluation of the original design, materials, fabrication, or potential erection deficiencies. Any information contrary to that assumed for the purpose of preparing this analysis could alter the findings and conclusions stated.
8. Tower member sizes and geometry are based on a tower mapping completed by Armor Tower in October 2012. Field measurements included NDT-Ultrasonic Thickness testing. Note that this is not a condition assessment of the tower. Existing light fixture loading was mapped by this office in October 2012.
9. Load carrying capacities of the proposed light fixture mount shall be provided by the mount manufacturer. If necessary armor tower can complete a separate mount certification under separate contract.
10. This tower does not have an industry-approved fall protection system installed. We recommend a flexible cable safety climb be installed.

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

Feedline Distribution Chart





We have completed the ANSI inspection of the subject towers. The purpose of the inspection was to determine the current condition of the towers, platforms, floodlights, and other appurtenances. The (8) sports lighting poles were located in the village ball park in Tupper Lake. Please see the overview of the site.

Our observations are as follows:

1. Overall structural condition of the towers are good. No significant corrosion was observed.
2. Tower masts are plumb.
3. A step bolt on Pole C-2 (Village of Tupper Lake Pole Location Drawings) is bent out of place causing a climbing hazard (see photo C2-03). Remedial action for this would be to remove the damaged step bolt and replace it with a new galvanized step bolt.
4. Base grouting on Poles B-1 & C-1 show significant signs of deterioration with missing areas and major cracks (see photos C1-01 & B1-01). Remedial action for this would be to remove the existing grout and to regrout the base.

Based on our observed condition of the towers, all members appear to be full dimensions with no deterioration that would affect the structural capabilities of the towers.

Dear Mayor Maroun and Board Members:

In preparation for the May 31, 2012, year end, we are providing a description of the work we propose to perform for the Village of Tupper Lake.

Engagement Description

Based on our experience at the Village, we expect the work to include the following:

1. We will submit a letter related to the Village's compliance with Section 4-408 of New York State Village Law.

Village Law of New York State, Section 4-408 states, in part, that the Village obtain an audit of its records and reports. However, the term "audit" as used in Section 4-408 does not contemplate an audit in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America as would be required in the conduct of an audit as defined by the American Institute of Certified Public Accountants. Furthermore, the Village's report of revenues and expenditures is not required to be prepared in accordance with auditing principles generally accepted in the United States of America. Therefore, our procedures are based on the review of the Village's internal controls and based on our assessment of risk to the Village and an analysis of compliance with controls. Where controls are less strong and in areas of higher inherent risk, additional testing of specific documentation and procedures may be appropriate.

§4-408 Procedures

In accordance with §4-408 of Village Law of New York State, we will perform the following procedures:

- I. Cash Disbursements

A sample of checks will be tested for the following:

- a. Appropriate signature(s), including proper use of stamp;
- b. Agreement of payee and amount with checkbook stub or check copy;
- c. Timeliness of cashing;
- d. Appropriate account coding on the voucher, and
- e. Cancellation of the original invoice or other documentation.

2. Bank Reconciliations

A sample of bank reconciliations will be tested for the following:

- a. Agreement of bank balance to general ledger;
- b. Verification that reconciler initialed reconciliation and that the reconciliation was reviewed;
- c. Verification that the reconciliation was performed in a timely manner, and
- d. Scan bank statements and reconciliations for any large or unusual items.

3. Accounts Receivable

A sample of billings will be tested for the following:

- a. Recalculation of the bill;
- b. Agreement of rates to appropriate support;
- c. Agreement of meter readings to appropriate documentation, and
- d. Tracing the cash receipts related to billing to the deposit slip and/or bank statement.

4. Tax Revenue

From a property map of the Village, parcels of property will be selected and tested for the following:

- a. Tracing property to assessment roll;
- b. Recalculation of the tax;
- c. Tracing to the tax bills printed by the county, and
- d. Tracing the cash receipt related to the bill to the deposit slip and/or bank statement.

5. Payroll

A sample of employees will be tested for the following:

- a. Verification of pay rate;
- b. Verification of approval of the payroll, and
- c. Tracing to documentation of budgetary approval.

6. General Ledger

A sample of items on the AUD will be tested for the following:

- a. Agreement of balances to the general ledger;
- b. Scanning for reasonableness of items;
- c. Analytical review of balances to previous year, and
- d. Test footing of balance sheets and statements of revenue and expenditures.

We look forward to hearing from you in relation to this engagement with the Village. We expect our fee to be no greater than \$7,500, excluding out-of-pocket expenses, which will not exceed \$500.






