NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that a Public Hearing will be held by the Board of Trustees of the Village of Tupper Lake, at the Municipal Office Building, 53 Park Street, Tupper Lake, NY 12986 on Monday, December 17, 2012 at 5:30 pm concerning proposed Local Law #3-2012 amendments to the Village Code, Chapter 9 entitled Fencing.

TAKE FURTHER NOTICE the said local law amendments to Chapter 9 of the Code of the Village of Tupper Lake, New York will be to create provisions for temporary fencing guidelines in the Village of Tupper Lake.

AT THE AFOREMENTIONED time and place all persons interested in the subject matter thereof will be heard concerning the same. The original of the above-mentioned amendments to local law, Chapter 9 entitled Fencing, is available for viewing at the Village Clerk/Treasurer's Office during regular business hours of 8:00 am to 4:00 pm, Monday through Friday.

FENCING

- 1) Definitions: The following words, terms and phrases, when used in this article shall have the meanings ascribed to them in this section, except where the context clearly indicates a different meaning:
 - a) Barrier – A fence, wall or other structure built to bar passage. Large Concrete blocks are used as barriers.
 - b) Fence – An enclosing barrier that prohibits through passage.
 - c) Fence: decorative – Fencing that adds beauty and does not substantially block the view and maintains the open space characteristic provided for by zoning standards.
 - d) Swimming Pool – A pool of water 24” or greater in depth either indoors or outdoors and is used for swimming or water related recreations. This also includes spas and hot tubs.
 - e) Visibility Range – Distance required to afford proper vision for pedestrian and vehicular traffic at intersections and/or corners.
 - f) Front Yard: A yard extending along the whole length of the front lot line between the side lot lines, and being the minimum horizontal distance between the street line and the main building or any projections thereof other than steps, planter boxes, unenclosed porches and driveways.
 - g) Pylon’s – Concrete pylon’s barriers monolithic structures to impede movement, or passage.
 - h) Temporary Fence – **A fence installed for a temporary event, construction site or for emergency reasons. A temporary fence can only be installed for one week unless the code officer feels there is good reason to keep the temporary fence up for a longer period of time. Emergency reasons would be a natural disaster, a fire scene or an unsafe condition etc...**
- 2) Permits Required - It shall be unlawful for any person to erect, construct, enlarge, alter, repair, replace, remove or demolish any fence regulated by this article without first obtaining a separate permit for each fence from the building official of the building inspection division of the community development department. A fence permit shall not be required if it is determined by the building official of the building inspection department that only minor repair or painting is necessary.
- 3) General Requirements and Restrictions:
 - a. Fences constructed on any lot, and specifically corner lots, will be subject to, and shall conform to, the visibility range requirements contained in the drawing at the end of this section. An additional clear zone may be required by the code officer.
 - b. No fence, guy wire, brace or post shall be constructed upon or extend over property that the Village has control over, owns, or has an easement over or under, except upon:



Tupper Lake Revitalization Project Status Update November 2012

2011 Microenterprise Program Grant - \$200,000

The Program Review Committee will meet at 10:00 am on Tuesday, November 20th to review the applications that were received in the first funding round. If all funds are not awarded in the first round, applications will be accepted and evaluated on a rolling basis.

Main Street Grant

The Office of Homes and Community Renewal has approved our request for an extension through next summer to allow for enough time to complete all projects. Property owners have been notified and are working with Friends of the North Country to advance their projects. New projects include: Shaheen's Motel, Larkin's, Maroun's Store and The State Theater.

We are looking forward to a publicity event highlighting the improvements when all are complete next year.

Syracuse University School of Industrial Design Contest

The Syracuse University School of Industrial Design students will present their ideas for reuse of OWD at a community meeting on the evening of Wednesday, December 12th. The meeting will be held at The Wild Center at 6:00 pm. All are welcome to attend.

I have been contacted by our Brownfield Opportunity Area project manager from DOS, and he is ready to hold a scoping session with the Revitalization Committee. Since the OWD site is such an important part of the BOA project, I have invited him to join us on December 12th and suggested holding the scoping session earlier that afternoon.

Revitalization Project Status Update

November 2012

At its November 29th meeting, the Revitalization Committee:

- 1) Discussed a Request for Expressions of Interest for consultant services to conduct the beach feasibility study, and
- 2) Reviewed the BOA project scope:

The BOA funding primarily focus on assessing reuse and redevelopment options for strategic sites that are catalysts for revitalization including but not limited to the Jarden site, waterfront sites and others as identified by the community. Key project outcomes:

- Identifying and providing a clear description and justification of a BOA subarea within the recently completed Revitalization Strategy and Action Plan;
- Filling any gaps in information available for the Jarden site, and other identified strategic sites that represent key redevelopment opportunities and are catalysts for revitalization;
- A market feasibility analysis of conceptual site reuse/redevelopment plans, to determine the feasibility of various reuse options for the Jarden site and other strategic sites, as well as other actions necessary for revitalization. Based on the analysis, a description of key findings and recommendations for future uses and other actions for redevelopment and community revitalization;
- If sufficient funds remain, marketing materials to promote developer interest in the Jarden site, and any other identified strategic sites where there are promising redevelopment opportunities.

We hope to use this funding to investigate the feasibility of a small hotel on the Raquette River waterfront, a key priority of the recently completed Revitalization Strategy.



Design students to propose ways to reuse former Tupper Lake factory

This semester the industrial and interaction design (IID) program in the College of Visual and Performing Arts challenged its fourth-year students to envision a creative new use for the former Oval Wood Dish (OWD) factory in Tupper Lake, N.Y. On Friday, Dec. 7, five student teams will present their results to a jury of professionals in an attempt to win the grand prize in the annual 360° IID Competition, which encourages comprehensive research, analysis and visionary problem-solving.

The presentations will be held at 6 p.m. in The Warehouse Auditorium, located on the first floor of The Warehouse, 350 W. Fayette St., Syracuse. A reception and the announcement of the grand prize-winning team will follow. The event is free and open to the public.

The winning team will receive the Philip H. Stevens Award, which is named in honor of Stevens '51, an industrial designer and president of Philip Stevens Associates Ltd. in Skaneateles, N.Y., who made a gift of \$100,000 to the program with his wife, Margueritte.

For this year's 360° IID Competition, Stevens suggested to Don Carr, professor of IID, that the students generate ideas to reactivate an idle factory. Carr, who owns a camp in Long Lake, N.Y. in the Adirondack Mountains, immediately thought of the former OWD factory in nearby Tupper Lake. Throughout the semester, the students conducted thorough design research—including site visits—to create ideas that would put the former factory and Tupper Lake on a path to a sustainable future.

"In our design classes, we often discuss the idea of 'sustainable product development' or sustainable enterprise," says Carr. "As designers of goods and services, whatever you create in this world comes with a carbon, economic and social footprint. Knowing how passionate people are about the Adirondacks, my feeling has been that if we can generate some viable ideas for Tupper Lake, this could serve as a great teaching moment."

The students formed five design groups—all named after local wildlife—and each team was assigned two industry advisors, the majority of whom are IID

alumni. Throughout the semester, each team blogged about their ideas and progress for the approximately 100,000 square-foot factory:

The teams will also present their ideas to the Tupper Lake Revitalization Committee and the local community on Wednesday, Dec. 12, at 6 p.m. at the Wild Center in Tupper Lake.

“In a parallel IID class taught by Kathleen Brandt, these same students are developing their design research skills,” notes Carr. “For me to discover that the teams took it upon themselves to make the trip to Tupper Lake throughout the semester to gain a better understanding of the people and their needs was wonderful. Therefore, when we present at the Wild Center, I hope the people of Tupper Lake see that their ideas were integrated.”

Judging the 360° IID Competition are Stevens; Greg Smiley, industrial design manager at the Raymond Corporation; Elet Callahan, professor of law and public policy at SU’s Martin J. Whitman School of Management; Scott Ryan, president of Brownlie Design; James Sonneborn, attorney at Bousquet Holstein PLLC; and Marcie Sonneborn ’76, G’77, G’89, small business innovation research (SBIR) specialist at the Central New York Technology Development Organization.

The New York State Adirondack Park Agency (APA) and the Department of Environmental Conservation (DEC), as co-lead agencies, have accepted a Final Supplemental Environmental Impact Statement (FSEIS) on the proposed comprehensive, integrated series of related actions for the area known as the Second Pond Boat Launch Intensive Use Area and a small portion of the High Peaks Wilderness Area. The Second Pond Boat Launch (also known as State Bridge Boat Launch) is located on State Route 3 approximately 3½ miles southwest of the Village of Saranac Lake. The site is the primary water access point for Lower Saranac Lake.

The DEC is proposing a Final Unit Management Plan (UMP) for the Second Pond Boat Launch Intensive Use Area. This plan proposes the reconstruction of the boat launch and parking area.

The APA is proposing amendments to the Adirondack Park State Land Master Plan (APSLMP) to reclassify 5.6 acres of Wilderness to Intensive Use and 6.8 acres of Intensive Use to Wilderness based on DEC recommendations developed in the Second Pond Intensive Use Area UMP. The Second Pond Boat Launch Reclassification Action and Unit Management Plan Approval FSEIS supplements the Final Generic Unit Management Plan and Environmental Impact Statement for Campgrounds and Day-Use Areas and the Programmatic Environmental Impact Statement Guidelines for Amending the Adirondack Park State Land Master Plan. The reclassification, because it is a revision to the APSLMP, requires approval by the Governor. Subsequent to the Governor's approval of the reclassification, the DEC Commissioner would approve the final UMP.

The APA and DEC prepared a Draft Supplemental Environmental Impact Statement (DSEIS) on the proposed reclassification; two public hearings regarding the proposed reclassifications and

Dear Mr. Bouck:

We are pleased to advise you that we anticipate there will be **no reduction in firm hydro energy sales to our hydropower customers for the period of January 1 through 31 2013.** The forecasted January 2013 generation is projected to be sufficient to meet our firm hydropower customers' needs. However, if that generation is not sufficient, Substitute Energy will be purchased on your behalf for those customers with signed Substitute Energy agreements.

Since hydro shortfalls may still be anticipated in future months, we remain prepared to provide Substitute Energy to assure continuous flow of the lowest cost power to you. For those customers who have executed a Substitute Energy agreement, the Power Authority will automatically purchase the Substitute Energy on your behalf in months that a shortage occurs, pursuant to those agreements, unless otherwise notified. The monthly price for Substitute Energy is an average of all Substitute Energy provided to firm hydropower customers each month.

The Power Authority continues to be concerned about the river flows projected for 2013. Current estimates are a 1.1% shortage for February, no shortage for March, a 1.8% shortage for April and no shortage May through July 2013. We will continue to analyze more current data monthly and provide this type of rolling 6-month forecast each month.


